REGISTRATION

Our annual registration fee is \$45 per student and must be paid in full at the time of registration, to hold your place in your selected class/es. You will be prompted to make this payment once you have selected your Term 1 classes.

CODE OF CONDUCT

To ensure the smooth, safe running of Extreme Dance and an enjoyable experience by all, below you will find our code of conduct. As always we are open to feedback, so if any of the requirements outlined below are unclear or concerning, please give us a call to discuss further. Following a formal meeting, we do reserve the right to dismiss or take disciplinary action on any students or parents who breach our studio's code of conduct.

Families who do not comply with their fee or costume payment obligations will be charged a late fee, and may be excluded from performances. External debt collection may occur when fees remain overdue and this will be at the expense of the client. Costume expenses are the responsibility of the parent, and costumes will not be issued to students with unpaid class fees.

We are unable to take responsibility for our students before or after their scheduled classes and it is the responsibility of the parent to ensure their child is picked up and dropped off on time. In the case of an emergency or unavoidable delay, please contact the studio immediately to inform us of the situation so we can keep your child calm and safe until they can be collected.

Any questions or complaints must go through the studio office – parents and students are not permitted to contact Extreme Dance teachers via phone, in person, or via email / social networking with studio issues unless it has been broached with the directors first. Personal meetings with the studio directors can happily be arranged via the office.

In the rare case of a parent or student showing disrespect or defamation to any parent, staff member or student, a meeting will be called immediately and dismissal may be considered at the discretion of the directors. Physical, mental, emotional or cyber bullying by parents, staff or students will not be tolerated and may result in dismissal from the studio.

Extreme Dance takes no responsibility for any stolen or misplaced property on the studio premises and we encourage our families to avoid bringing valuable items into the studio where possible.

Only private lesson students are permitted to enter solo competitions and it must be with the permission of their teacher/choreographer.

Extreme Dance management reserves the right to change teachers or timetables when necessary at any time throughout the year.

In the event of a lockdown or similar event, Extreme Dance management reserves the right to shift all classes to an online learning platform.

Choreography and studio policies remain the intellectual property of Extreme Dance and may not be reproduced or sold by any students, parents or staff without permission of the director/s.

PRE-SCHOOL CLASSES

Baby Steps - for toddlers under 3 years (minimum age 18 months)

An introduction to dance through music, movement & creativity.

Children participate together with a parent/caregiver.

First Steps (3 & 4 years)

Imaginative dance adventures for kids who love to move!

Our exclusive Pre-School dance programme designed for 3 & 4 year olds.

First Steps classes are our pre-ballet programme

Dancely (3 & 4 years)

Dancely is for 3 & 4 year olds designed, to get them moving, shaking, and most importantly, having fun! Dancely features original music from the award winning songwriters at Disney, Netflix and Marvel, with original choreography from world renowned dancers, who know exactly the moves that make kids jump for joy with delight and excitement.

Dancely classes are our pre-jazz/hiphop programme.

CLASSES FOR DANCERS FROM 5 YEARS UPWARDS

Classical Ballet (Royal Academy of Dance)

RAD Graded & Vocational syllabus from Pre-Primary to Advanced 2

Character work is incorporated in classes from Grade 1-5

Beginner class - NZAMD Pre-Grade 1.

Children may begin ballet the year they will turn 5.

Lyrical

Our lyrical programme offers non exam classes to explore and enjoy lyrical dance.

Children may begin lyrical when they reach grade 3 ballet or jazz.

Jazz (NZAMD American Syllabus)

Classes from Pre-Grade 1 – Advanced 2.

Children may begin jazz the year they will turn 5.

Solo Performance Diploma (by invitation)

Contemporary (NZAMD Syllabus)

Classes from Introductory to Level 6.

Children may begin contemporary when they reach grade 4 ballet or jazz.

Solo Performance Diploma (by invitation)

Hip Hop

Our hiphop programme offers non-exam classes that cover a range of street dance styles.

Classes are grouped by age: 5-6, 7-8, 9-10, 11-13, 14 years & over

Tap

Our tap programme offers non-exam classes to explore and enjoy the fundamentals of tap dance, with a focus on rhythm and technique.

Children may begin tap from the age of 6.

Open Classes

Intermediate Open Ballet – Open class for Intermediate Foundation/Intermediate ballet students, and dancers wanting a once-a-week class. Minimum level Intermediate Foundation.

Advanced Open Ballet – Open class for Advanced ballet students, and Advanced dancers wanting a once-a-week class. Minimum level Advanced Foundation.

Progressions class (Grade 4 level & above) - Open progressions class. Perfect for dancers who are looking for extra training to master their skills with leaps, kicks & turns

Conditioning - Dance fitness - increase your strength and endurance. Minimum age 8/9 years - Grade 2 level. This class is FREE for dancers in Performance groups, or dancers taking 4 or more classes.

Advanced Open Class 15 & over – Advanced level open class. Advanced/Pre Professional level - age 15 years & over.

Performance Groups & HipHop Crews

Students will be selected for performance groups based upon ability, reliability, and attitude. Although it is an honor to be in one of these groups, it is also a large responsibility and commitment. These classes are by invitation only.

An invitation one year does not guarantee an invitation the following year.

CLASS REQUIREMENTS FOR BALLET:

Pre-Grade 1/ Pre-Primary/Primary: 1 class per week (additional classes as scheduled prior to exams)

Grade 1 & 2: 1 class per week for terms 1, 2 & 4. 2 classes per week in Term 3.

Grade 3 & 4: 2 classes per week throughout the year.

Intermediate Foundation/Intermediate: 3x Intermediate Foundation/Intermediate classes per week. Optional (recommended) Intermediate Open class.

Advanced 2: 2x A2 syllabus classes per week, PLUS Adv Open class, PLUS Adv 2 Saturday class at NZSD

EXAMS

As a studio who values the growth and commitment of our dancers from all ages, it's our pleasure to offer exams/assessments to students in Ballet, Jazz and Contemporary as a part of our programme. Here are our approximate exam dates for 2022:

While exams are not compulsory, our vast experience shows that formal exams present a unique opportunity for the children to display and take pride in how hard they work and are able to progress in their classes. Our exam students always find their exam experience to be uplifting, beneficial and rewarding.

Exams are conducted by external examining bodies (RAD & NZAMD) and exam fees are charged by these organisations. We collect the exam fees and pay them on your behalf.

Prior to each exam session we will send out comprehensive information about the exam procedure, additional exam classes & mock exams and exam fees.

The exam timetables are usually provided by the external examining body, and we are unable to request certain dates of times for a particular student. Exams are held during the day from 9am to 5pm, so students may require some time off school for their exam.

UNIFORM "If you look like a dancer, you feel like a dancer."

At Extreme Dance we are a uniform studio. We believe that wearing studio uniforms gives students a sense of belonging to our family as well as creating an identity for our studio in the greater community. Our uniforms also:

- Encourage discipline
- Help students resist peer pressure to buy stylish clothes for class
- Help identify non-students in the studio
- · Diminish economic and social barriers between students
- Increase a sense of belonging and school pride
- Improve attendance

Grooming expectations for dance class

All students are required to wear the correct uniform to every class.

Girls must have their hair in a bun for all classes except HipHop. For HipHop, please have your hair tidy and secured off your face with no loose bits.

No jewellery (including watches) is to be worn in any class, except small earrings.

Underwear is not worn under leotards (just like swimming togs!) Older girls who require a bra for support must ensure that there are no visible straps. Specialist dance underwear can be purchased, and if worn, must not be visible.

Your look at all times should be professional. We take your dance training seriously, and we expect you to take pride in your appearance for class.

Baby Steps

Children – comfortable clothing to allow freedom of movement. OR own choice of dress up – fairy dress, batman cape etc. Bare feet or ballet shoes, children may not dance in socks or tights - footless leggings are a great idea in the cooler months.

Adults – comfortable work-out clothing and bare feet.

First Steps

Your choice of pre-grade ballet uniform as listed below, or your choice of leotard/skirt/fairy dress/dress-up etc or t-shirt & shorts.

Leather ballet shoes & socks are required – pink for girls, white for boys. Please purchase ballet shoes from a dancewear retailer, NOT play ballet shoes, or canvas ballet shoes.

Dancely

Your choice of pre-grade jazz uniform as listed below, or your own choice of leotard/skirt/dress-up/tshirt and leggings or shorts.

Bare feet or ballet shoes are fine.

Ballet - Pre-Grade 1, Pre-Primary & Primary

Regulation ballet uniform dress. This is a short sleeved lycra dress with an attached mesh skirt, NOT the Farmers pink ballet dress.

Style: Capezio 3966C Short Sleeve Nylon Dress - Colour: Pink

or White t-shirt & navy shorts

Pink leather ballet shoes with $\frac{1}{2}$ inch flesh elastic & flesh coloured ballet socks or white leather ballet shoes with $\frac{1}{2}$ inch white elastic & white ballet socks.

Optional pink crossover cardigan for warmth in winter.

RAD Pre-Primary & Primary uniform will be hired from the studio at Exam time.

Ballet - Grades 1-2

Marine Blue cotton lycra RAD regulation leotard with matching elastic belt.

Style: Paul Wright Faith (Marine Blue) OR Energetiks CL04 (Turquoise)

or White short sleeved leotard worn under navy bike shorts.

Black full circle character skirt (length = 7.5 cm below the knee) with blue ribbons & black canvas character shoes with low heel or black canvas lace up character shoe.

Pink leather ballet shoes with 1/2 inch flesh elastic strap & flesh coloured ballet socks or white leather ballet shoes with 1/2 inch white elastic & white ballet socks.

Optional crossover cardigan for warmth in winter.

Ballet - Grade 3-4

Navy cotton lycra RAD regulation leotard with matching elastic belt.

Style: Paul Wright Faith (Navy) OR Energetiks CL04 (Navy)

or White short sleeved leotard worn with a dance belt under navy tights.

Black full circle character skirt (length = 7.5 cm below the knee) with blue ribbons & black canvas character shoes with cuban heel or black lace up character shoe.

Pink leather ballet shoes with 1/2 inch flesh elastic strap & flesh coloured ballet tights or white leather ballet shoes with 1/2 inch white elastic & white ballet socks.

Optional crossover cardigan for warmth in winter.

Ballet - Vocational (Intermediate Foundation - Advanced 2)

Black plain camisole style leotard.

Flesh coloured ballet tights.

or White short sleeved leotard with dance belt worn under black tights.

Intermediate Foundation – Pink flat ballet shoes with ribbons or white leather ballet shoes with ½ inch white elastic & white ballet socks. Pink satin pointe shoes – the teacher will advise when these are required.

Intermediate & above – Pink satin demi pointe shoes & pink satin pointe shoes, all with ribbons or white leather ballet shoes with ½ inch white elastic & white ballet socks.

Uniform regulation leotards must be worn 1 class each week – Class TBA.

Coloured leotards are acceptable for alternate class/es.

Shorts & Skirts are NOT worn for any Vocational ballet classes.

Skirts and Tutus for Exam variation dances will be hired from the studio at Exam time.

Open Ballet Classes

Shoes and tights as above (Flat ballet shoes may be worn for open classes)

Either regulation uniform leotards as above, or classical ballet leotards in other colours may be worn. Shorts & Skirts are NOT worn for any ballet classes.

Jazz & Tap, Progressions - All Grades

3/4 plain black leggings, Extreme Dance racer panel shorts or Extreme Dance alpha tights (optional black fitted dance shorts for class, not for exams), or plain black bootleg dance pants

Black Extreme Dance muscle back top, Extreme Dance madison tank top or Extreme Dance blue and black obsession or alpha crop tops.

or

Black 3/4 dance pants, Extreme dance drawstring shorts or Extreme Dance racer panel shorts Black sleeveless Extreme Dance top

- Black jazz or tap shoes with black socks.
- Slip on jazz shoes without laces are preferred for all levels.

Contemporary

Black cotton lycra wide strap camisole leotard.

Style: Paul Wright Bronwyn OR Capezio Princess Tank CC202 / CC202C OR Energetiks Wide Strap Camisole AL11 / CL11

Black cotton lycra 3/4 leggings or Extreme Dance alpha leggings worn over leotards.

or

Black 3/4 dance pants or leggings with Black sleeveless Extreme Dance top

- Bare feet.
- Shorts are NOT worn for any contemporary class.

Lyrical - Junior class

Black cotton lycra wide strap camisole leotard.

Style: Paul Wright Bronwyn OR Capezio Princess Tank CC202 / CC202C OR Energetiks Wide Strap Camisole AL11 / CL11

Black lyrical skirt – hired each year from the studio.

Tan or flesh footless/convertible lyrical tights.

or

White short sleeved leotard OR Black sleeveless Extreme Dance top with black 3/4 dance pants or leggings

Bare feet

Lyrical - Intermediate/Senior class

Black cotton lycra wide strap camisole leotard, or Extreme Dance crop top/muscle back/singlet top 3/4 plain black leggings, Extreme Dance racer panel shorts or Extreme Dance alpha tights or black fitted dance shorts.

Bare feet

Hip Hop – All classes

Your choice of any Extreme Dance t-shirt / muscle back / crop top / sleeveless boys' top (Extreme Dance uniform top must be worn for class)

Own choice of plain black dance pants / track pants / Extreme Dance jet double shorts, racer panel shorts or alpha tights. **NO skirts, NO jeans, NO denim of any kind**.

Plain Black Converse style hi-tops or plain black sneakers for all HipHop classes (our preference is that these are only worn in class please to protect the studio floor for other dancers)

Advanced Open Class / Performance Groups / HipHop Crews / Soloists

Your choice of dancewear – appropriate to the genre of dance.

Performance groups require fitted dancewear please - rather than baggy tshirts.

Jazz shoes/bare feet for performance group depending on choreography.

Plain black converse/sneakers for hiphop crew.

PAYMENT TERMS

Invoices for each term's tuition will be emailed to you prior to the beginning of the term. There are two options for payments:

Option 1 - Pay invoice in full before the start of the term

Option 2 - Split term fee into 8 even weekly payments that are paid on the Wednesday of weeks 1 - 8 either via the DSP parent portal, by AP to Extreme Dance bank account (ASB 12-3223-0028709-00) or in the studio office. If payment is not made by Wednesday of each week, then the balance of that term's fees will be payable in full immediately along with a \$40 late payment fee.

Invoices are due in full before the first day of each term, unless Option 2 has been taken and you have notified the office.

A \$40 late payment fee will be added to any payment arrangement that is defaulted on.

Fees are based on an average 8 week term and are calculated over the entire year. This takes into account statutory holidays, exam days and that terms differ in length and some are longer or shorter.

Makeup classes will be offered if the year falls short of 32 weeks.

Students who start class mid-term will be invoiced pro-rata with payment due once their enrolment is confirmed.

Lessons missed will not be deducted.

For students who leave during the term, the fees are non refundable.

All Fees are GST inclusive.

If you wish to withdraw from classes at Extreme Dance, it is a requirement that you notify the studio in writing.

PAYMENT METHODS

Payment can be made by:

- Online by credit card via Dance Studio Pro this is our preferred method
- Online AP payment if a payment plan has been set up
- In the studio office by EFTPOS/Credit Card or Cash

ATTENDANCE

Your child's attendance in class is vital for their progress, and very important to their peers and our teaching staff.

As a member of the team, it is a commitment for you to ensure your child attends their classes on time each week and attends all lessons planned for them.

Not only do absences impact the progress of the class, it also impacts the social and confidence-building principals we work hard to foster in each age group.

If you know ahead of time that your child will be absent due to holidays/vacations, commitments or school trips, please let us know ahead of time so the class impact is minimal.

If your child is too unwell to attend class, we ask that you inform the office as soon as you can so they can let the teachers know. You can also log your child's absence in your Dance Studio Proparent portal.
